

Maths

- **Place Value**— we will look at ordering and comparing numbers beyond 1000 including rounding
- **Shape**— Children will look at properties of shape symmetry
- **Measure**— we will focus on time durations—hours, minutes, seconds, days, months, years and telling the time

Self care

- We will teach children to be responsible for personal hygiene
- We will teach children how to use a digital clock

Topic

Science— We will be Constructing and interpreting a variety of food chains, identifying producers, predators and prey with a focus on sea animals They will also explore the requirements of plants for life and growth.

DT— We will use appropriate tools and techniques, mark, cut and shape a range of materials accurately. We will also be cooking weekly and looking at balanced diets and their importance

Geography— children will learn to locate and name the countries making up the British Isles, with their capital cities.

History - children will be able to place people and events into correct periods of time- with a focus on the royals

RE— we will explore human responsibility and value with a focus on treatment of animals for religious beliefs

Art— we will Use a variety of techniques such as printing, dying, and weaving for textural effects. Explore colouring (natural and man-made dyes) or patterning material We will use fabric crayons to design party t-shirts for the Queen's Jubilee

PE—Our focus will be on using running, jumping and catching in isolation as well as in combination. We will also teach children to identify the techniques they need to practice to improve their strength and performance in athletic activities.

Computing— This term we will focus on online safety and controlling devices and coding
